Questions from Committee	Carson City School District
What has your district done to increase participation in school breakfast by implementing school breakfast after the bell?	With a decrease in reduction of staff and budget, we have not implemented breakfast after the bell. Our breakfast participation is equal to that of last year, even with losing 349 students in our overall District enrollment. We have implemented more of the students' favorite breakfasts in hopes that it would improve participation, however we are holding at about 13%, which is equal to last year, even with enrollment being down.
What has your school district done to eliminate the reduced-price meal category?	With budget constraints facing our State, we have not moved forward to eliminate the reduced price meals.
Does your school district use Provision 2?	Not at this time.
What has your school district done to ensure that the Summer Lunch Program is available to children in all neighborhoods containing a school designated as 50% in need?	About the last two weeks of May, we distribute posters in numerous Food Chain Stores, Community Services Welfare Office and the Employment Offices around Carson City, as well as placing a "Press Release" in the local newspaper telling parents that there is a summer program available for any child between the ages of two and eighteen who can receive a free breakfast and lunch, Monday through Friday during the summer months, and it is always located in a neighborhood designated at 50% in need.

We have sponsored a Summer Food Service Program, partnering with the Boys & Girls Club of Nevada in Carson City for over fifteen years and will be providing meals to approximately 300 students for lunch and 150 students for breakfast again for summer 2010.

Looked at a universal free option, no charge for reduced price option while charging for full paid, and options of collecting money or not collecting money for meals in the classrooms. Outcome: breakfast in the classroom is not financially feasible in schools with less than approximately 80% free & reduced price eligibility.
What has your school district done to eliminate the reduced-price meal category?	Studied financial impact and feasibility of providing meals free of charge to reduced price eligible. Outcome: Current federal reimbursement of \$2.28 per reduced price lunch and \$1.16 per reduced price breakfast does not cover the cost to produce those meals unless the percentage of FRL is greater than the likely breakeven point of 70%. State reimbursement is needed to help cover the loss of local revenue.
